## Charming Panel Pillow

From Background Fabric:
(A) Cut 2 pieces $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 18.5^{\prime \prime}$
(B) Cut 2 pieces $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 14.5^{\prime \prime}$

From Accent Fabric:
(C) Cut 2 pieces $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$
(D) Cut 2 pieces $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$
(E) Select 24 mini charm squares or cut $242.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(F) $8.5^{\prime \prime}$ square center panel

All seams are quarter inch
Assembly:
Starting with the center panel $F$, sew a piece $D$ to the top and the bottom of the panel and press. Sew pieces $C$ on each side of the panel and press. Take 10 of your mini charm squares, divide them into 2 groups of 5 , sew them together to form 2 units $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$ and sew them on the top and bottom of your block as pictured below. Take the remaining 14 mini charm squares and divide them into 2 groups of 7 , sew them together to form 2 units $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 14.5^{\prime \prime}$ and sew them to the sides of your block as pictured below. Sew pieces B to the top and bottom of your block, press and then take the remaining A pieces and sew them to the sides of your block and press.

Now that your pillow front is pieced, you can finish the pillow in your desired manner. I fuse my pillow fronts to fusible fleece, and then quilt as desired. For this particular pillow I cut 2 rectangles of background fabric $13.5^{\prime \prime} \times 18.5^{\prime \prime}$, hemmed the long edge of both pieces overlapped them and finished the pillow in envelope style.
